What is a Title I school?

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Title I, Part A Section 1116 provides financial assistance to state and local agencies to meet the needs of at-risk children.

The goal of Title I is to provide instructional services and activities which support students in meeting the state's challenging performance standards.


How does our school spend Title I Funds?

- As a District and in conjunction with federal guidelines a small percentage of our Title I money is allocated to have Family Engagement Coordinators at the District Level.

What are our school goals?(Reading/ELA)

- By May 2024 80% of Pre-K students will demonstrate proficiency with letter recognition of 18 upper and 15 lower case letters.
- By May 2024 90% of Kindergartners students will demonstrate mastery of all sounds up to digraphs on the LETRS Spelling Inventory.
- By May 2024 90% of 1st-grade students will demonstrate mastery of all sounds up to VCe (silent E) words on the LETRS Spelling Inventory.
- By May 2024 the percentage of second-grade students scoring at the 60th percentile or above on MAP Growth Reading will increase from 41% to 45%.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 4th grade performing a level 3 ro 4 in English Language
 Arts will increase from 40% (3rd grade score) to 43% (4th grade score) on the Georgia Milestones
 Assessment.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 5th grade performing at a level 3 or 4 in English
 Language Arts will increase from 40% (4th grade score) to 43% (5th grade score) on the Georgia
 Milestones Assessment.

What are our school goals? (Math)

- By May 2024 75% of Pre-K students will demonstrate mastery of identification, rote counting, and
 1:1 correspondence of numbers 0-20.
- By May 2024 65% (75%) of Kindergarten students will perform at the 60th percentile or higher on MAP.
- By May 2024 (63%), 67% of students in 1st grade will perform at the 60th percentile or higher on MAP.
- By May 2024 (55%) 60% of students in 2nd grade will perform at the 60th percentile or higher on MAP.
- By May 2024 (44%) 50% of students in 3rd grade will perform at the 60th percentile or higher on MAP.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 4th grade performing at a level 3 or 4 in Math will increase from 41% (3rd-grade score) to 45% (4th-grade score) on the Georgia Milestones test.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 5th grade performing at a level 3 or 4 in Math will increase from 61% (4th-grade score) to 65% (on 5th-grade score) on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Professional Learning Community - The Four Questions

At Woodstation teachers and staff work together in PLC's to help your child succeed.

- 1. What do we want all students to learn?
 - Georgia Standards of Excellence
- 2. How will we know if they have learned it?
 - Assessment data, CFA's or CSA's
- 3. How will we respond if they don't learn it?
 - o Reteach, small groups, individualize instruction
- 4. How will we extend learning for those who know it?
 - Deepen learning, enrichment or extension

What programs/supports are in place to help my child?

At WES we offer different programs to support our students. Some of these include:

- Intervention time (WIN- What I Need) at WES we schedule
 Tier 1 (Core) / Tier 2 (Reteach) / Tier 3 (Intervention Time)
- Extra learning programs for students including Lexia and iReady Reading/Math/and ELA
- After school tutoring for 2nd/3rd/4th/and 5th grade students.

What tests will my child be taking?

Students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades will take the <u>Georgia</u> <u>Milestones Assessments</u> in the spring.

All students in Kindergarten-5th grade will also complete Benchmark testing (MAP Assessment) several times throughout the year. These tests help show us what your child already knows, and what areas we need to focus on. You will learn more about these assessments during our FAST Meetings.

How do these assessments measure my child's progress?

These tests measure student growth from year to year in reading (ELA) and Math.

Students will receive a RIT score (Rasch Interval Unit) which is an estimation of a student's instructional level and also measures student progress or growth in school. We will help you interpret your student's RIT score at our FAST meetings.

Students will score in one of four levels on Georgia Milestones.

Level 1: Beginning Learner

Level 2: Developing Learner

Level 3: Proficient Learner

Level 4: Distinguished Learner

At Woodstation, our goal is to have all students score Level 3 or Level 4 on the Georgia Milestones Assessments.


