⇒ **ASSESSED MATH NEED SECOND GRADE:**

WES Second Grade Teachers

- The second grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:
- Teachers will send home high frequency words, spelling words, and fluency passages with comprehension questions.
 - Teachers will send home addition and subtraction facts and area of focus practice sheet.

WES Second Grade Students

- WES students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in reading and math. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:
- Play learning games at home with my family.
 - Read each night with a family member
 - Read non-fiction books at home

At Home

WES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success.

- I will read the class newsletter so that I am informed of what will be taught and will give me the ability to help my child learn at home.
- I will try to attend Family and School Team (FAST) academic nights and conferences, and if I am unable to attend, I will ask for the information from the school Parent Involvement Coordinator.
- I will read at home with my child and practice reading skills such as learning sight words, vocabulary words, fluency and reasoning.
